1. Summary and action-points

This was a very successful workshop. Our team was inspired by the invited guest speakers, many of whom contributed comments of direct value to our current prototyping. As an example, Robin Shaerverbeke, architect and lecturer in drawing techniques at Sint Lucas School of Architecture, Ghent volunteered to teach a student in Stockholm in real-time, using our prototype of the Mediated Sketching-table – augmented, for the occasion, by web RTC functionalities recently developed by the group. Our prototype between KTH-Delft however did not function adequately on the day, primarily because we had not purchased similar equipment in the two locations. We learned that failure is part of prototyping and design, and then decided to set up the proposed workspace and spatial layout of the Mediated Sketching Table, between TU Delft Pi-Lab and EIT Presence Lab at KTH, as a continuous workspace for the work group in August and onwards.

Further, we discussed the two FP7's lined up for 2013, realizing that the health-oriented Augmented Hospital-Home application deadline is mid-January and work needs to start swiftly.

I want to thank my co-organizer Tjerk de Greef for hosting the event in such a brilliant way. We ate well and we had access to excellent work facilities. Our tuning-in session in the Vermeer Centre was particularly inspiring. We also thank Ruud van Zijl, Project manager MultiMedia Services TU Delft / Library/MultiMedia Services & Collegerama and his colleagues for an exciting session using Chromakey possibilities. Thirdly, we thank Jesper Olson, KTH Master Student for helping us with video documentation (see links further down).

Action-points:

- Friday 10 August, 10GMT, is our first work group meeting after the summer break. Hans Janmaat, TU Delft Masters student who has carried out an internship at EIT Presence Lab at KTH in the spring, will then present his work creating a webRTC interface for the Mediated Sketching Table, which otherwise also incorporates horizontal analogue drawing surfaces, interactive surfaces and also objects whose actions can be monitored remotely; besides the possibility to see a remote party with decent eyecontact. Thus, we will work together this autumn and develop our prototypes as we go. Three parties should be able to work together, following the ideas and actions of the 'three Pirates' of the Pocket Negotiator narrative. As before, a regular work group meeting takes place Fridays 9 GMT, in Google Hangout until further notice.
- The TU Delft department of Industrial Design, through Professor Huib de Ridder, is an interested third party, which also contributes with expertise in e.g. light, sound and industrial design towards Augmented Hospital-Home relationship FP7. A proposal to create a third Presence Lab Space in the ID Living Room will be made at a meeting 120626 (See Appendix 1: June Prototyping).
- Purchasing of necessary equipment cameras, projectors and screens will now be carried out and installed before end of August, so that a well-functioning set-up is in place, linking three locations: at TU Delft and KTH.
- Robin Shaerverbeke will be invited to repeat his remote drawing class early autumn. Will also be invited to KTH, when suitable.
- Work to advance FP7 on Augmented Hospital-Home relationship needs to start swiftly. One A4 with a description of the idea and consortium needs to be ready by end of August, to bounce with appointed EU coordinators. A meeting introducing NKOC Hanneke de Ridder, ID Prof Huib de Ridder to Kristina Groth KTH/Karolinska takes place 120626. A trip to Stockholm will be scheduled end of August/beginning of September. All interested are invited to propose partners and focus areas to Harold Nefs/Tjerk de Gref/Charlie Gullström, currently taking the lead.
- Also work to advance FP7 Mediated courtroom must start, deadline likely April 2013. Monday 17 September, before MP Workshop 3, on Relation, in Stockholm 18-20

- September, will be dedicated to this theme; (while Wednesday 19 September will be dedicated to Hospital). Same group as above currently gather ideas, partners and focus areas. A Stockholm meeting with Swedish Ministry of Justice user group and visits to existing courtrooms will be organised in August.
- Several countries offer 7500-10000€ funding to write EU-applications. All are encouraged to seek such funding possibilities.
- Hans Janmaat who ends his successful 3-month Master student internship at EIT Presence Lab, KTH R1 in June, will be invited to carry out additional work relating to webRTC presence components, in collaboration with Peter Parnes, to be presented at a creative user applications workshop for at EIT Presence Lab in Stockholm 16-17 October, organised by Peter, Charlie and Leif as part of Charlie Gullström's task towards Multimodal Activity 2012.
- A collaborative paper to ISPR Presence conference will be submitted by the group involved in prototyping for the Mediated Sketching Table, aka Shared Negotiation Spaces.
- Our next workshop, on RELATION, will take place in Stockholm 18-20 September at the EIT Presence Lab, KTH Main Campus, including sessions in the EIT Colocation Center on KTH KIsta campus. The evening of 17 September and the full day 18 September are 'open workshop days' with invited guest speakers. 18 September includes an Innovation radar workshop - creative think tank and future fore sighting, with Magnus Boman. On 19-20 September, prototyping continues within a smaller group, following the needs of the Mediating Presence work group. The workshop is also devoted to assembling a consortium for EU FP7 applications beginning 2013. One relates to the topic of an Augmented Hospital-Home Relationship (meetings preliminary set to 19 September); one to The Mediated Courtroom Horizon 2020 (meeting preliminary set to 17 September. It was discussed earlier that the workshop can include a boat trip to Helsinki, to share experiences with the EIT Smart Spaces project and its installations at the Helsinki Colocation Centre, HIIT, Aalto and a visit to the Multitouch company. This Helsinki visit needs to take place on another date (co-organized with Marko Turpeinen, Konrad Tollmar, Kai Kuikkaniemi). 2. Background and organisation

This was our second workshop in 2012 and we based the format and agenda on our experiences from the first workshop, successfully organised in the EIT Presence Lab at KTH R1 in March. We therefore planned this workshop in two parts: 17-18 June were open workshop days which 23 participants attended, while the 19-20 June were devoted to prototyping within a smaller group of ten researchers, relating to the Presence Demonstrators which will be developed within the activity during 2012.

The evening of the 17th June served as a tuning-in and get-to-know-everyone session so that Monday 18th can be devoted to theoretical and practical work on the theme of TIME, e.g. timing, intentionality and synchronization in relation to ongoing prototyping. Invited guest speakers, designers and performers contributed to this topic and helped us explore innovative connections to our research.


